Mark Dvorak — "Chicago's official troubadour" — is headed to the Northwest suburbs for an 11:30 a.m. Thursday, Sept. 19 show at the **Elk Grove Village Library**, 1001 Wellington Ave.

His performance is part of the "Senior Moments" program for adults aged 55 and older at the library.

"Mark had been recommended to us by several of our members and we're excited to have him entertain our group," said Donna McCarthy, program and events coordinator for the library.

Dvorak has taken time off the road this summer to work on his 18th recorded release, "Let Love Go On", due out in October.

"At this stage of the game," said the singer, "I feel like I'm doing my best work. I'm very excited about the new CD. I'm in the home stretch now with just a few more songs to record. It's taken me awhile to get the thing together but I'm very proud to have performed, engineered and produced the whole album. I've got some new material coming along and will include some of my all-time in-concert favorites too."

Dvorak has performed in 38 states as well as parts of Europe and Canada. He has won awards for journalism and children's music. He was honored in 2008 with the Woodstock Folk Festival Lifetime Achievement Award and the FARM Lantern Bearer Award from Folk Alliance in 2013. In 2012, WFMT 98.7 FM "Midnight Special" host Rich Warren named him "Chicago's official troubadour."
